

Man's shirt -> Nice blouse

A very simple way to transform old man shirt – from your dad/boyfriend's closet or even from the thriftstore!

Step 1 — Cut the sleeves



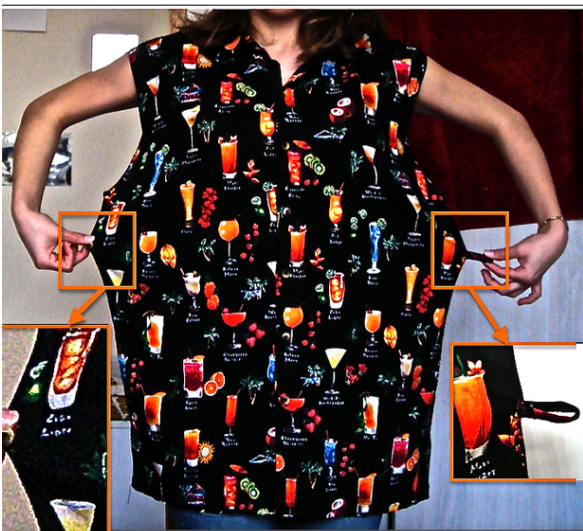
Cut the sleeves on the seam's edge, so you don't have to overlock or hem it. You can then transform it into a cap sleeve - I thought it would look good but I was too lazy, I just left it the way it was. You can also take the front pocket out (I did).

Step 2 — Stitch the armhole



As your shirt is too big for you, the armholes look weird because they are too wide. Simply stitch them on the outside, leaving a big enough hole for your arms.

Step 3 — Stitch the closure



Now you want to make the shirt fitted. I used the hem of the pocket to make a small strap, and I stitched both the extremities on a side seam to make a loop, on the other side seam I stitched the button from the pocket. (ON THE OUTSIDE) Luckily, the size was perfect for me, but it may not be, so instead of a loop and a button, you may stitch two small straps to tie the shirt.

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
