Banana Bag DIY



Fruit accents are seen everywhere on garments and accessories! Follow this tutorial on how to turn a boring white bag into a fun and colorful banana bag.

Step 1 — Stencils



Save the banana stencil image above, and print out on paper. Trace the full-size patterns for the spray-paint stencils (large and small banana).

Step 2 — Trace on cardboard



Trace each pattern twice onto cardboard. With the craft knife cut out the whole banana once and once just the area of the black \hat{A} -shadow. Glue paper strips to all sides of each stencil to make it slightly \hat{A} -larger than the bag \hat{a} — this protects the bag from paint spots. Cover the work surface generously with newspaper and lay a thick layer of newspaper in the bag.

Step 3 — Yellow paint



With the yellow paint and using the stencil, spray paint the bananas onto the fabric. Carefully remove and allow to dry at least 3 to 4 minutes. Let the paint dry thoroughly between the individual sprayings.

Step 4 — Black contour



With the contour template and using the black spray paint, spray over the bananas to get their 3-D effect. Subsequently allow to dry thoroughly.

Step 5 — Little Bananas



Use the smaller banana template and the yellow spray paint to scatter little bananas over the bag.

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
