Tunic Top burda style magazine patterns FAQ

Materials

batiste

Step 1 — Preparation

Trace pattern pieces from the pattern sheet.

Seam and hem allowances:

Seams, edges and hem 1.5 cm (5/8 in).

Step 2 — Cutting out



1 front yoke, on a fold 2x
2 front, on a fold 1x
3 back yoke, on a fold 2x
4 back, on a fold 1x
5 sleeve 2x

Interfacing: See pattern layout. Interface outer yoke pieces.

Step 3 — Machine embroidery

On yoke pieces, hand-baste along neck and armhole edges to make these lines visible on right side of fabric. Embroider one line of cross stitch each along neck and armhole lines. Embroider three more lines of different cross stitch patterns parallel to the first lines. Fill inner surface of yoke pieces with vertical lines of cross stitch. Press the finished embroidery. Lay paper pattern pieces on the embroidered fabric pieces again to correct the seam lines, if necessary

Step 4 — Yoke

Stitch side seams and shoulder seams on outside and inside yoke units. Stitch side seams on front and back. Gather upper edge of front and back. Stitch outer yoke to upper edge of front and backs. Press seam allowances onto yoke.

Step 5 — Inside yoke

Lay inside yoke right sides together with attached yoke. Stitch along neck edge. Trim seam allowances. Clip curves several times. Lay inside yoke up and stitch to seam allowances, close to seam. Turn yoke right side out and press edge. Turn in edge of inside yoke and sew to joining seam. Baste armhole edges to gether without turning in.

Step 6 — Hem Allowance

Press hem allowance to inside, turn in, and stitch in place.

Step 7 — Sleeves

Stitch sleeve seams. Press sleeve hem allowances to inside, turn in, and stitch.

Step 8 — Sleeve Caps

Set in sleeves, gathering sleeve caps.

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
