Jacket with zipper burda style magazine patterns FAQ

Materials

wool crpe

Step 1 — Preparation

Trace the pattern pieces from the pattern sheet

Seam and hem allowances:

Seams and edges 1.5 cm (5/8 in), Å-sleeve hems 4 cm (15/8 ins). Cut lining pieces with 1.5 cm (5/8 in) seam and hem allowances.

Step 2 — Cutting out



Wool crepe:

1 front 2x

2 back 2x

3 side piece 2x

4 upper sleeve 2x

5 undersleeve 2x

6 front facing 2x

7 back facing, on a fold 1x

8 pocket 2x

9 front peplum 4x

10 back peplum 4x

Lining: piece 1 to lining line; piece 2 to lining line and at centre back with an ease pleat of about 2 cm (3/4 in); piece 8 minus width of facing; pieces 3, 4 and 5.

Interfacing: See pattern layout. Interface outer peplum pieces. Also interface sleeve hem allowances.

Step 3 — Neck and bust darts

Stitch neck darts and bust darts. Stitch centre back seam. Stitch side pieces to front and back pieces. Stitch shoulder seams and facing seams.

Step 4 — Patch pockets

Stitch pocket lining to self-facing of each pocket piece, leaving about 5 cm (2 ins) open in the centre, for turning. Press seam allowances onto lining pieces. Fold facings and lining outward and stitch to side and lower pocket edges. Turn pockets right side out and press. Sew seam openings closed. Pin pockets to fronts, at abutting lines, and sew in place by hand.

Step 5 — Peplum

Stitch centre back seam and side seams on peplum pieces. Stitch outer peplum to jacket fronts and back. Press seam allowances up. Stitch bottom ends of front facings right sides together with inside peplum. Clip allowance of inside peplum at ends of seams. Press seams open.

Step 6 — Zip

For sizes 36 — 42, shorten the separating zip to 41 — 42 — 43 — 44 cm (16 1/4 — 16 1/2 — 17 — 17 1/4 ins) long. Measure and mark required length on zip. Use pliers to remove the top stoppers and surplus teeth. Reattach the stoppers if your zip is made of metal and press firmly to secure. The stoppers of a plastic zip cannot be reused. Instead, sew heavy thread bars across the top of the zip tapes, to prevent the slider from slipping off. Trim zip tapes 2 cm (3/4 in) above the teeth.

Step 7 — Zip halves

Separate the zip halves. Pin halves of zip right side up to inside peplum and front facings (right side of fabric) beginning at bottom edge, so that edge of each zip tape meets exactly with seam line of front edge and seam allowance extends. Stitch along centre of each zip tape. Lay teeth of zip forward and press seam allowances onto facing and peplum. Lay facing and inside peplum right sides together with jacket so that zip teeth meet with seam line of front edges and allowances of front edges extend. Pin neck edges and lower edges of peplum each together. Fold allowances of front edges to outside and pin to neck edge and to

lower edge of peplum. Stitch along neck edge and lower edge of peplum. Trim seam allowances. Turn facing and inside peplum to inside. Press allowances on front edges of front pieces and outer peplum to inside. Baste halves of zip with facings and inside peplum under front edges so that zip teeth are covered. Sew facings to front allowances, above zip. Topstitch 7 mm (1/4 in) from front edges.

Step 8 — inside oedge of peplum

Lay inside edge of peplum over joining seam and pin. Work from right side of garment to stitch in line of seam, beginning and ending about 5 cm (2 ins) before front edges.

Step 9 — Sleeves

Sew sleeves and set in.

Step 10 — Lining

Sew lining. Stitch lining to inside edges of facing, clipping seam allowance of facing into corners and leaving about 8 cm (3 1/4 ins) open at the bottom. Lay lining inside jacket with wrong sides facing, pulling linings into sleeves. Turn in lower edges of lining and sew to peplum joining seam. Sew remaining front edges of lining in place. Pin a fold in lining, about 1 cm (3/8 in) deep, at sleeve hems. Turn in sleeve linings and sew to hem allowances. Remove pins and press extra length of lining down.

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
