Bubble skirt sewing pattern burda style magazine patterns FAQ NOTE: This pattern sheet is the same as for the V-neck LBD #110 and the High-waist Secretary Skirt #112, it includes pattern pieces and lines for these projects as well. Please read the instructions for information on which pattern pieces to cut for which garment.

Materials

Jacquard fabric with crosswise stretch

Step 1 — Preparation



Paper cut for ANSI A (German DIN A4) prints:

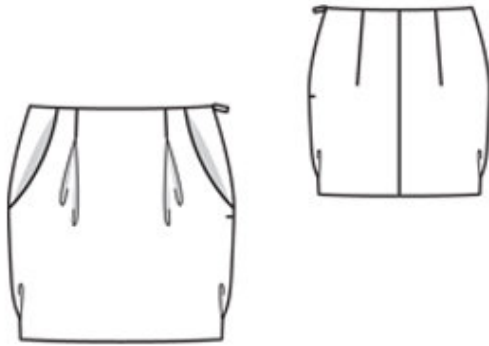
This pattern is printed on 8.5 × 11 sheets of plain paper. Do not scale or center pages before printing. Wait until all sheets are printed out before beginning to tape them together. **Do not cut out pattern pieces yet**— Arrange the sheets on a large, hard, flat surface so that they fit together, matching up like numbers and letters (i.e. 6A to 6A). To tape pattern together, fold under the margin of one piece (6A) and tape right against the line of it's matching number/letter (6A).

burda style magazine pattern do not have seam allowance included.

Seam and hem allowances to be added: Seams and edges 1.5 cm (5/8 in).

Step 2 — Cutting out



Jacquard:

29 front skirt panel, on a fold 1x

30 pocket piece 2x

31 side hip yoke with

integrated pocket piece 2x

32 back skirt panel 2x

Lining: pieces 29 and 31, placed together as instructed under Preparation , and also piece 32.

Vilene Bias Tape/stay tape Iron to wrong sides of upper edges of skirt lining pieces.

Step 3 — Back darts

Stitch back darts and press darts toward centre. Stitch the centre back seam. Press the seam allowances open.

Step 4 — Pleats

To sew the pleats (upper skirt edge) and the hip yoke pockets.

Step 5 — Zip

Stitch the right side seam. Sew invisible zip to left slit edges. Stitch left side seam from lower edge to zip opening. Press the seam allowances open.

Step 6 — Lining

â—'Stitch darts and seams of lining, leaving slit for zip open (as mirror image of slit on skirt). Fold pleats and baste to upper edge.

Step 7 — Face upper edge of skirt

Place lining over skirt, with right sides facing. Pin lining to upper edge of skirt. At zip opening, turn lining back, approx. 5 mm (3/16 in) before edge of opening, and pin to upper edge. On skirt, turn allowances on opening edges to outside and pin to upper edge, over lining. Stitch along upper edge of skirt. Turn allowances on opening edges to inside. Turn lining up and stitch to seam allowances, as far as possible, close to seam. Turn lining to inside and sew to zip tapes.

Step 8 — Hem

Press hem allowance to inside and sew in place by hand. For the hem pleats, lay front and back skirt pieces right sides together again, with the side seam along the fold. Stitch from edge of hem to arrow mark. Lay the pleats in the direction of the arrows and press. Work from outer side of skirt to stitch along line of pleat seam. Hem the lining so that it is approx. 2 cm (3/4 in) shorter than the skirt.

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
