## **Cuff's / Collar's Corners**

It is a very simple trick but, as for me, quite useful when making cuffs or collars. I used this technique for any kind of them that have a right or more acute corner. The thicker fabric or the more acute the corner, the harder it is to make a neat corner without any bulging.

### Step 1 — Stitching




When joining the details of your cuff or a collar, just make a cross stitch in the corner instead of the following the line. If the fabric is not very thin, you can make a longer stitch - 4-5 mm. The most important it must be the only one cross stitch!

#### Step 2 — Cutting



When trimming the seam allowance, in the corners do the same - cut the fabric across but not too much!

Step 3 — Turning Out



When you turn the right side of the cuff or collar out, spread the fabric in the corner with a big needle.

Step 4 — Preparing for Ironing and Sewing

Now baste your cuff or collar and it is ready for further processing: for ironing and sewing to the sleeve ( if it is a cuff) or neckline (if it is a collar) and top stitching. I use the pictures of the cuffs from my new project but in the same way I work with any collar's details.

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
